
SPRING SUMMER FALL WINTER

ACCESS: From Portland, take Highway 224 to Highway 211 and Use: Light turn left. (These highways intersect near the town of EagleDifficulty: Most Difficult Creek.) Follow Highway 211 a short distance to Folsom Road, then follow Folsom Road to Eagle Creek Road (which is the old highway). Go two miles past Estacada High School. Follow Squaw Mountain Road (which is a right turn off Capland Road) for eleven miles. Stay right at the fork in the road - you should be on Road #4614. Go 6.5 miles past the fork to a trail which crosses the road. Head east on this trail for 0.5 mile, until you reach its junction with Old Baldy and follow it 1.5 miles to its intersection with Eagle Creek Cutoff Trail #504.

ATTRACTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS: This is a steep, narrow trail which receives minimal maintenance. It provides quick access to the Upper Reaches of Eagle Creek and the Eagle Creek Trail. It is located within the Salmon-Huckleberry Wilderness therefore wilderness regulations apply.

NARRATIVE:

Eagle Creek Cutoff Trail #504 is a rugged trail which has received sporadic maintenance over the last few years. There is a good viewpoint about 0.7 mile from its intersection with Old Baldy #502 overlooking the Eagle Creek drainage.
